

Instructions for In-person Worship

The service will also continue to be streamed live on Facebook.

Instructions:

- Please plan to arrive early. It may take a while to get everyone checked in and seated.
- Wash your hands thoroughly prior to leaving home. The CDC recommends hand sanitizer when soap and water are not readily available. 70% alcohol hand sanitizer will be available but should not be relied upon.
- Check in at the pop-up tent. Those of the same residence should stay in line together and sit together.
- At the tent, your attendance will be recorded so that we may notify you if there is any discovered potential for exposure.
- A 3-ply disposable facemask (made in USA) will be given to you to be worn during the entire worship service. Children under 2 should not wear masks.
- Your temperature will be checked.
- Remaining in your group, maintain 6' separation, and proceed to the entrance.
- You may drop your offering in the silver pail on the vestibule table.
- When you enter the sanctuary please follow the directions given by the usher/pastor. You will be directed to proceed down either the center or a side aisle. We are sitting in every other pew.

- Please avoid physical contact and practice verbal welcoming.
- When we dismiss, the usher will dismiss folks beginning from the back. Please remain seated until you are dismissed by the usher.
- The restrooms will be open but only use them if absolutely necessary or to wash your hands.

Special Considerations:

- We understand that it may be difficult to wear the mask continually. Should you need to remove it, please walk outside before doing so.
- If you are unable to use the front steps to enter the sanctuary, you may enter from one of the side doors adjacent the accessible parking spaces. Masks will be available from Pastor David who will be at the front.

We are making what we believe to be our best efforts to keep us all safe, from masks to cleaning; but, please be aware that we cannot guarantee that you will not be exposed to someone who has the virus. We encourage you to use your absolute best discretion as to whether you should risk being present.
